- 18% increase in graduation rate over the past 8 years with Hispanic students rising from 52% to 88% and students navigating poverty rising from 53% to 83%
- 9 out of 10 seniors graduated in 2020
- Real-World Learning/Career & Technical Education (RWL/CTE) programs expanded
- Board advocated for the legislature passing and fully funding of RWL/CTE leading to stronger graduation rates.

Where we are

- Supported the district and teachers working collaboratively for over a year to build plans for distance and hybrid learning, and the return to in-person instruction.
- Ongoing priority supporting **mental health** clinics and **social-emotional learning programs** that have been crucial during the pandemic and transition back to in-person learning.
- Strategic planning in advocating for and using state and federal emergency funds efficiently and promptly to meet the needs of children and families.
- We supported the district in being ready for reopening when conditions were right including early access to personal protective equipment, air purifiers, and cleaning supplies.
- We are actively planning on providing summer learning, with a goal of providing students what they have been missing during the pandemic and give them a running start into the next school year. We are partnering with private, local, and state partners in order to **double what has been done in previous summers**.

- Take the lessons learned from the pandemic (from district families, educators, and schools) to strengthen the work being done in the district so all, not some, of the students reach their potential.
- Work closely with educators and families to understand where students are and what they need for social and academic success in the coming year.
